Mexico



Mexico is an incredible country that is rich in culture and history. With nearly 6,000 miles of coastline along the Pacific Ocean, the Gulf of Mexico, and the Caribbean Sea, some of the most beautiful beaches in the world can be found here. The water is perfect for snorkeling, kayaking, diving, and even whale watching! Beyond the beaches there are many Mayan ruins, the most famous of which is Chichen Itza in Yucatan, Mexico. The culinary culture is also vibrant and flavorful, as are the urban centers like Mexico City. There is something for everyone, so prepare yourself for an incredible trip!

Climate

Mexico has a varied climate, which means that there is at least one area of the country that is prime for a vacation at any time of the year. The predominate climate is warm-tropical and it can get very hot and humid in areas such as Cancun or Cozumel. West coast destinations, such as Cabo San Lucas and Puerto Vallarta have more desert-like climates, similar to Arizona or New Mexico. The hottest months of the year are May to July, with the wettest part of the year being from June to October.



Cuisine

Mexican cuisine largely features corn, beans, tomatoes, chili peppers, and rice. Corn is a staple of Mexican cuisine, and can be found in everything from tortillas to corn on the cob. Street food is also a large centerpiece of Mexican cuisine, and includes tacos, quesadillas, and tamales. Due to the size of the country, the cuisine of Mexico is also rather regional. The three main regional cuisines are Oaxaca, Veracruz and Yucatan. Authentic food in Mexico is very different from the Mexican or Tex-Mex generally found in the United States.

Attire

Due to the varied climate, you should bring clothes that are functional for a variety of weather conditions. If you are traveling to high-altitude locations such as Mexico City (7,382 feet above sea level), it is best to pack long sleeves or a jacket, as it can get cold. Long sleeves are also recommended for outdoor activities to prevent insect bites. On the east coast, the weather is hot and humid, so it is best to pack light breathable clothing, and swimsuits for the beautiful beaches.

Culture

Mexico has a very rich culture with an emphasis on festivals and fiestas. Some of their biggest celebrations are: the Day of the Dead on November 2nd, a spiritual day honoring family and friends that have passed away, Independence Day on September 16th, The Feast of our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12th, and Revolution Day which is the third Monday of November.

These are just a few of the celebrations in Mexico, so be sure to look up any holidays near your destinations that feature dancing, food, and musical performances, as they are not to be missed!

Getting There

Many popular destinations in Mexico are easily accessible from the United States and Canada, with nonstop flights everyday, on a number of major airlines. Cruise ships also make ports of call at many of Mexico's coastal destinations.

Getting Around

Since Mexico is a large country, with many interior regions that are quite dangerous, it is advised that you travel by air domestically. The drive from Cancun to Tulum, however, is a safe and easy drive down a quality highway. Buses are also another option if the locations are not too far from each other.

Health Tips

Travelers should be up to date on all routine vaccines and take precautions to avoid mosquito bites. Because conditions continuously change, we recommend checking the latest updates from the <u>Center for Disease Control and Prevention</u>. To avoid water-borne or food-borne illness, drink bottled or canned beverages, and only eat thoroughly cooked food.

Money

Mexico's local currency is the Peso, which is easy to get via an ATM at a major bank, or your hotel. US Dollars are also widely accepted

in Mexico, but you may find that you get a better deal when paying in Pesos. Gratuities are also expected for tour operators, restaurant staff, bell boys, etc. Paying tips these in Pesos will save that person from having to change money.

Sailing Trips

Enjoy a relaxing sailing cruise along the coast of Cabo San Lucas. You will not only catch a beautiful Baja sunset, but you may have the chance to stop in secluded bays and coves to explore areas away from the busier beaches. Depending on which tour you choose, you can even snorkel or paddle board.



The Arch of Cabo San Lucas

A must see attraction in Cabo is The Arch, a rock formation rising three stories above the sea. You can paddle board or kayak around this famous landmark to see marine birds, fish, and sea lions. You can also snorkel near Pelican Rock or, for a more relaxing experience, lay out on Lovers Beach.



Scuba Diving & Snorkeling

Explore the open waters of Cabo by scuba diving or snorkeling. With great conditions year round, you'll have the chance to see sharks, turtles, sea lions, and even dolphins. Don't worry if you're not scuba certified, you can take a PADI certification course or try a "Discover Scuba" dive that doesn't require certification.



Hiking at Fox Canyon

Strap on your hiking boots for a guided trek through a tropical desert on the Fox Canyon Trail. You'll walk next to a river and through the mountains in dense vegetation until you arrive at the Sol de Mayo Waterfall, where you can cool off in the freshwater pools.

Jeep Tours

Hop into a 4x4 jeep and go off-road on mountain trails. You will make strategic stops to take photos, visit the quaint fishing village of Pesquero, along with Cabo Pulmo National Park. The Park is a protected area that's known as the Aquarium of the World, where you can snorkel among the diverse marine life of the coral reefs.



Sea Kayaking & Stand Up Paddling

Take a kayak, or paddle board along the beautiful Cabo coast and visit popular destinations like The Arch and Lovers Beach. If you choose a glass-bottomed kayak, you will be able to see the colorful fish and other marine life right beneath you!



Dolphin Encounters

Make a new marine friend with dolphin encounters in Cabo San Lucas. Learn all about the Pacific bottlenose dolphin from the best possible teachers - the dolphins themselves! Since you'll be meeting your new friends in a pool with experienced trainers, this encounter is perfect for families, and even non-swimmers.



San Jose City Tours

Explore the beautiful city of San Jose with its 18th-century colonial Spanish architecture and laid-back local scene. You can visit the city during the day for its organic markets and learn about the rich native history, or you can take an art walk tour at night to admire the creative work of locals.






Humpback Whale Watching

Take a whale watching cruise in Cabo to see some of the humpback whales that migrate from Alaska to the warm waters of Mexico and Central America. Both educational and exciting, these tours will allow you to see these majestic creatures in their natural habitat - you may also see a colony of sea lions sunbathing on the rocks while you're out at sea!





Whale Shark Encounters

Whale shark season is from October-March, during which time you can go snorkeling with whale sharks. A trained marine biologist will take you out to a protected bay where the sharks come annually to feed. You'll be able to interact with the whale sharks in their natural habitat and learn about the scientific research being done by the Whale Shark Research Project.


Tulum & Akumal Mayan Ruins
